# Thinking of You

1. Cut a 4 1/4" x 11" piece of Sugar Cube cardstock and fold in half for a cardbase.
2. Stamp the largest Zinnia 3 times using the following ink combinations, then die cut with the coordinating die:
  - Potato Chip, Lemon Meringue, Dijon
  - Cupcake, Strawberry Milkshake, Lollipop
  - Lemon Meringue, Candy Corn, Pumpkin
3. Stamp the long stem using Granny Smith and Peapod inks. Diecut the stem.
4. Stamp the sentiment on Earl Grey cardstock with Versamark. Heat-emboss with white embossing powder. To die cut, center the Stitched Banner Stacklets die over the left side of the sentiment, cut half way through. Reposition the die to the right side of the sentiment. Flip around the die cutting half Tway through again. This should extend the diecut banner to the length of the sentiment.
5. Trim a 4 1/4" x 5 1/2" piece of Sugar Cube cardstock. Sponge with Salt Water Taffy ink, fading from the lower left corner up. Die cut the Leafy Vines Cutting Plate from scrap cardstock or copy paper. Use the diecut as a stencil to sponge on another layer of Salt Water Taffy ink fading from the lower left corner up. Tip: Use a daubing-motion rather than a swirling-motion. Die cut with the largest Stitched Rectangle Stacklets.
6. Adhere the card together using the following notes:
  - Use foam adhesive under the sponged background.
  - Attach the yellow Zinnia with foam tape.
  - Adhere the sentiment banner with foam adhesive,
  - Tie a twine bow and attach with liquid adhesive.
7. Apply a scattered amount of clear enamel drops.
